# Question

- Ho Chi Ming set out meet the needs of the peasants



What was significant about the Tet Offense



- American people realized that “we” were far from winning the war
- Johnson lost support for sending our troops to fight in a double civil war



# Question

Why were the Vietcong successful despite the advances of the US military weapons?

- They used a tunnel system
- Was able to “booby trap” old weapons
- Hard for American soldiers to identify “friend” or “foe”
- Used guerilla warfare
- Knew the terrain and adjusted to the weather
