U.S. History Decades Project

<u>Objective</u>: For students to research various aspects of American culture and politics during their assigned decade (1960's, 1970's, 1980's, 1990's or the 2000's). This is also an opportunity for students to work on research, communication and presentation skills.

Your Group Research Essential Question: How did the (insert decade) impact the United States socially, politically and economically?

- 1. **Directions**: Students will work in groups of 4-5.
- 2. Each group member will select an aspect(s) of their era (see topics below) to research.
- 3. Each project should include information on the following: (Who will be responsible for what? Write their Names on the Line.)

a)	Fashion/Clothing/Hairstyles (men and women)	
b)	Music	
c)	Entertainment/Recreation/Leisure	
d)	Values (Culture, what was important, slang, etc.)	
e)	Politics (Presisents, wars)	
f)	Economy	
g)	Inventions, technology	
h)	Social Changes and/or Concerns	

- 4. This project should provide the audience with an overall idea of what happened during that decade and what it would be like to live during that time period.
- 5. After researching the topic, students will need to determine the format the project will take.
- 6. Different formats that may be used (but are not limited to): Video, display boards, actual artifacts, scrapbook, PowerPoint presentations, slide show, games, demonstrations, or a combination of these formats.
- 7. Outline Due: 4/14. Research for project will be due on Friday, April 21. Presentations will begin Monday, April 24.
- 8. The presentation should take 7-10 minutes it should be an interactive, "live experience".

Project requirements:

- 1. Thorough information provided about the assigned decade (2-3 paragraphs per topic see above) combined into one Google Doc/Word document per group.
- 2. At least 3 different sources per section (in addition to the textbook) are used for researching the decade (**NOTE**: **Wikipedia is NOT a valid resource**)—You do not need **24 DIFFERENT** sources; however, your group must have at least **10 DIFFERENT** sources
- 3. All group members must partake in researching and putting the project together it must be identified who was responsible for what (See example at end)
- 4. The presentation must be multi-media (using different types of content text, pictures, music, video, PowerPoint, etc.) <u>Must use at least 3 mediums</u>
- 5. Need to include a works cited/bibliography.

Step 1 - Research and Data (must use at least 3 total sources per component: group total---24)

1. Fashion

- a) What type of clothing was popular during that time period?
- b) Popular accessories?
- c) Popular hairstyles?
- d) Make sure to illustrate difference between Men and Women and also social classes

2. Music

- a) What type music was popular during that time period?
- b) What musicians were popular?
- c) Try to find specific examples that could be listened to in class

3. Recreation/Leisure

- a) What venue was used for entertainment? (movies, music, television, sports, etc)
- b) Popular activities (dances, games)
- c) Any popular movie stars, sports figures
- d) Food What was the American diet like? Popular restaurants and/or meal? Usually cook at home or dine out? (Bring samples?)

4. Values/culture

- a) What was important to the American people during that time period?
- b) How did they view women? People of color?
- c) Were there any movements or revolutions during that time period?
- d) Were there any popular sayings or slang?

5. Politics

- a) Who were the presidents during the decade?
- b) Any political scandals?
- c) Any wars?
- d) Major pieces of legislation

6. Economy

- a) How was the economy at the time?
- b) What was the unemployment rate?
- c) Were there any shortages?
- d) How was the tax rate?

7. Inventions/Technology

- a) Were there any important/influential inventions that came out of your decade?
- b) How did the inventions impact the American people?

8. Social Change?

- a) Were there any periods of Social Unrest (protest, challenges that concerned the American people)?
- b) How were these challenges faced?
- c) Is our society still concerned or plagued with these challenges?
- d) What can we do as citizens to overcome present concerns about these social challenges?

Step 2 - Project

- 1. Compile your groups' research into a google doc/word document
- 2. Determine format of the presentation (can include skits, PowerPoints, demonstrations, handouts, overheads, etc.)
- 3. Include at least 2 visual aids
- 4. Be sure to include maps, graphs, photographs or other visuals to illustrate information about the time
- 5. The presentation should be multi-media (i.e. video clips, display board, PowerPoint, music from CD or IPod, etc.)
- 6. Include a TYPED bibliography/work cited
- 7. AND include a typed list of all group members and what each group member was responsible for

- 8. The presentation should be a "live experience" try to be interactive
- 9. You must be present the day of your presentation!
- 10. Presentations should take 7-10 minutes. Have fun and be creative!
